Our carefully selected bulbs undergo special temperature controlled treatments after they have been harvested. This has the effect of advancing development of the embryo bud, and makes it possible to bring them into flower considerably earlier than unprepared bulbs. **Minimum quantity supplied 100 of any one variety.**

**DUTCH HYACINTHS (not prepared)**

All varieties of Hyacinth are suitable for indoor growing and for bedding. Our range includes varieties flowering indoors from early January through to late February. The normal outdoor flowering time is April. For exhibition and indoor display use, we recommend 16/17 cm size bulbs. The smaller sizes are more suited for outdoor planting.

**TULIPS**

This genus is still immensely popular and the numerous species and varieties are cultivated on a very large scale. **The Darwin Hybrids** deserve a special mention as they are impressive, strong and good value for money. Outdoor planting commences from October and can carry on until the end of November. The heights and outdoor flowering periods given are for average mainland localities in a normal season. **Minimum quantity supplied 250 of any one variety.**
